Terms:

- 1) **Bidding increments will conform to the following:** \$ 10 to \$19 (\$1 increments)
Any bids not conforming will be rounded down to the next bidding step. \$20 to \$49 (\$2 increments) \$50
The starting price is the reserve price \$50 to \$200 (\$5 increments)
\$201 or over (\$10 increments)
- 2) Only those members in good standing with the BCS can participate.
- 3) All bidders can submit their bids with confidence as we will sell the lots for one increment over the second highest bid.
- 4) Lots will be invoiced and delivery of lots will be made upon receipt of payment.
- 5) **Payment can be made by Sterling cheques to Martin Taylor or US\$ cheques made payable to The Bermuda Collectors Society. Visa and Mastercard are accepted and will be charged by De Montfort Stamp Co.**

Abbreviations and Catalogues Used

All catalogue numbers are from Bermuda Specialized Catalogue - Scott (SC) and Stanley Gibbons (SG) latest catalogues with other catalogues such as Michel, Murray Payne etc used when appropriate. Higgins & Gage World Postal Stationery catalogue numbers are used for postal stationery.

Condition

Lots are described with as much detail as is possible giving due deference to gum, perforations, postmark etc and the condition of same is relative to that particular issue and age. All lots are sold without defects and as genuine unless noted in lot description. Collections and accumulations may contain items with faults, which may not be mentioned in lot description. The majorities of covers are commercial use and as such may have minor tears or creases etc, which are only mentioned if they considerably reduce the value of the item. If lots do not match catalogue description they can be returned for full credit within 7 days of receipt.
