TERMS: This is a members-only mail auction. All bids are confidential. Highest bid wins. In case of ties, the earliest bid wins. Winning bid will be one increment above the next highest bid. Minimums are the reserves.

BIDDING & BIDDING INCREMENTS: Only bids from members in good standing will be accepted. Minimums and bids will be in US Dollars. Bids accepted in EVEN DOLLARS only. Bids with fractions (ie: \$5.50) will be lowered to the next even dollar amount. Email bidders please include your mailing address with bids. Increments will be as follows: \$0 to \$20 → \$1.00; \$20 and above → \$2.00

LOTING: Each consignor's lots will be listed consecutively whether stamps or covers. The auctioneer may hold lots depending on space requirements. We hope to list as many lots as the front and back of a single Bermuda Post page can accommodate. Held lots will appear in a future issue of Bermuda Post.

CONSIGNORS: Each consignor must briefly describe his/her lots - one line of text including minimum bid would be ideal with a maximum of two lines for items with minimums above \$20. Consignors will be assessed 15% of the winning bid with those proceeds going to the Bermuda Collectors Society. Proceeds from sales (minus the 15% sales fee and postage) and any unsold lots will be returned to the consignors after the sale is concluded.

BIDDERS: At the end of the sale winning bidders will be notified by email or snail mail and items won will be dispatched upon receipt of payment for those items plus postage. Winning bidders are expected to pay within TEN (10) days. There is no buyer premium.

PAYMENTS: Payments MUST be in US Dollars via a check drawn on a U.S. bank or by PayPal in U.S. Dollars. We cannot accommodate credit cards, cash, nor payment in foreign currency.

WEBSITE ACCESS: The auction listing will be posted on our website (bermudacollectorsociety.com) for about a month prior to you receiving it as part of the Bermuda Post. Items with high minimums and unusual items will be scanned onto the site at John Puzine's discretion. Bidders can also email John for a scan.

AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION: Regarding listings and/or disputes, the decision of auctioneer is final.
